
Some aim for political achievements. Others make great strides in medicine, combating disease and prolonging physical life.

Why don't we see Rainbows all of the time?

To see a naturally occurring rainbow, conditions have to be just right. There has to be a lot of water droplets in the air and the sun has to be at your back as you look at the droplets. If these two things are happening then you will see a rainbow!

Sunlight is made up of different colours of light. When sunlight enters a water droplet each colour is refracted (or bent) a different amount by the water, so that the colours spread out. When the colour is reflected from the inside surface of the droplet, it is refracted again as it goes back out into the air which spreads out the colours even more. Since there are many droplets at different heights above the ground and each droplet refracts a colour that reaches our eyes, we are able to see a complete rainbow. When I see a rainbow, it lifts my spirit. I love the colours and am always amazed at how big it is! But a rainbow can also tell us some things about God.


